

**Requirements of VNMU regarding compliance with
the Rules for Admission of Foreign Citizens who arrived in Ukraine for
the purpose of study:**

- Palestine: the average score of the document on complete general secondary education, which is at least 80% (for specialties 222 Medicine, 221 Dentistry) and at least 65% (for specialties 226 Pharmacy, Industrial Pharmacy).
- Republic of Lebanon: training should be received in secondary school in the following fields: general sciences, natural sciences, sociology and economics. The number of points is indicated in the document "Certificate of passing exams for a diploma of secondary education". The passing score must be at least 280 points, regardless of the score that may be obtained for a separate exam in one or another subject or discipline (50% of the maximum possible score). The total maximum score is 560 points.
- Arab Republic of Egypt: the minimum passing score of the document of complete general secondary education for the admission of applicants to the specialties indicated below, provided that they have completed training in the disciplines required for their field of study, must be: 222 Medicine - 98% (402 out of 410 points); 221 Dentistry – 97.8% (starting with 401 points); 226 Pharmacy, industrial pharmacy - 96.82% (397 out of 410 points).
- The Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan: the minimum passing score of the document on complete general secondary education: 222 Medicine - 80%; 221 Dentistry - 80%; 226 Pharmacy, Industrial Pharmacy - 75%.
- Republic of India: admission of applicants is subject to a certificate confirming successful completion of NEET availability. The Medical Council of India reserves the right to check the documents, and in case of violations of the current legislation of the Republic of India, to revoke the above certificate.
- Republic of Ghana: the minimal requirements for the results of the completed examinations specified in the educational documents: The minimum number of subjects is 6 (six), of which three must be graded no lower than D7: mathematics (basic course); English language; integrated sciences / social sciences (the best grade from the specified disciplines is chosen). The total number of points is no more than 36 ("one" or A1 is the highest point). The other three subjects are chosen according to the best results. Levels from A1 to D7 inclusive are considered passing. Regardless of the number of points, E8 level is not a pass.
- The Federal Republic of Nigeria: the minimum passing grade is "C"; the minimum number of disciplines is 5 (five); compulsory subjects are English and mathematics.
- Republic of Zambia: the right to continue studying in higher education programs is given by a certificate of secondary education (Zambian School Certificate). The minimum number of disciplines that are taken into account during admission to higher education institutions is 5 (five) with a grade not lower than 6 (six).
- Republic of Namibia: when calculating the passing score for holders of educational documents issued by educational institutions of Namibia: take into

account at least 6 (six) disciplines; independently determine the admission requirements for holders of educational documents issued by educational institutions in Namibia.

- Republic of Kenya: the minimum grade indicated in the document of secondary education issued by the educational institutions of the Republic of Kenya, which gives the right to enter the institutions of higher education of the Republic of Kenya, is "C".
- Republic of Sudan: education documents issued by educational institutions of the Republic of Sudan must include a mandatory list of subjects: Arabic, English, Islam, mathematics. The minimum score for each discipline is 50.
- Kingdom of Saudi Arabia: there are two ways to legalize applicants' certificates obtained in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia: 1) The education document is legalized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, and then by the KSA embassy in Kyiv; 2) The document is legalized directly by the Embassy of the KSA in Kyiv, as the Embassy has a list of all general directories for upbringing and education in all regions of the KSA. Given that the Embassy of the KSA in Kyiv has the authority to legalize educational documents, there is no need to legalize the document by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the KSA. In this case, further certification of documents is carried out by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine in Kyiv.
